Dear Reid.

I have a few questions and comment re the Subpart W rulemaking.

Question:

1. The EPA Rulemaking Docket does not include a NEPA Analysis, nor is there any mention of compliance with NEPA in the Proposed Rule in the section on Statutory and Executive Orders Review. Can you explain this lack of an NEPA review associated with the proposed rule or any mention of NEPA compliance in the FRN?

We have address this issue twice. During the October 17, 2013 stakeholders conference call (attached) and in an email from Susan Stahle, below;

Hi Sarah -

I cited Clean Air Act (CAA) section 307 not as support for why EPA is not required to comply with NEPA when taking action under the CAA; instead, I cited CAA section 307 as applicable to the public notice and comment process we were discussing on the call today.

Section 7(c) of the Energy Supply and Environmental Coordination Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 793(c)(1)) exempts actions under the Clean Air Act from the requirements of NEPA. Section 793(c)(1) states: "No action taken under the Clean Air Act shall be deemed a major Federal action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment within the meaning of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (83 Stat. 856) [42 USCS §§ 4321] et seq.]." This is why EPA is not required to conduct a NEPA analysis for this Subpart W rulemaking.

I see that EPA issued a DEIS for the 1989 radionuclide rules, but I do not see a final EIS for those rules. I don't know whether that document was prepared for NEPA purposes, or whether it was prepared for other analytical purposes. The document itself does not indicate that it was for NEPA compliance purposes. It may be that EPA prepared that document for other analytical purposes, I just don't know. Regardless of the reasons for that document back in 1989, EPA does not have a legal obligation to prepare those documents for NEPA compliance purposes for this Subpart W rulemaking. However, please note that EPA is preparing the requisite background documents for this rulemaking and those

will be available for public review and comment when we publish the proposal for public notice and comment.

The analyses required under CAA section 312 is a "comprehensive analysis" of all EPA rules issued under the CAA prior to November 15, 1990. According to section 312(d), that report was due to Congress back in 1991. Thus, I do not believe section 312 is applicable to this rulemaking. However, please understand that EPA is preparing the appropriate cost and benefit analyses for this rulemaking as required by other statutes and Executive Orders, and those analyses will be available for your review once we publish the proposal.

The opportunity you note for oral presentations in CAA section 307(d)(5) will be addressed in the proposed rule. In the proposal, we will specifically offer the public the opportunity to request a public hearing on the proposed rule. If we receive such a request, we will hold a public hearing, and the public will have the opportunity to make oral presentations at that public hearing. More details on this process will be contained in the proposal.

I hope this answers your questions.

I also was able to reach Andy and Cristina at NTAA. They are doing 2 things relative to the Subpart W Rule Revision:

- Preparing comments from NTAA on behalf of all tribes (These are being developed and will be vetted with tribes before comment are finalized)
- Helping to assist individual tribes submit comments (A template letter based on the NTAA comments, and a "distillation" of the rule to focus comments.)

Andy is aware of UMU consultation but they have not been actively assisting the tribe.

Cristina made a very practical suggestion which OAQPS has done (e.g. carbon rule) that has proven very helpful in from both EPA and Tribal perspective; a Comments Guideline Document in table form that succinctly states the areas we are seeking comment. From Cristina's perspective this has been a popular tool for tribes, and really focuses comments. The comment table language is taken directly from the proposed rule.

Cristina also senses that tribes and other groups see the Subpart W as a precursor to the ISR/ISL revisions.

We should continue to use the monthly NTAA calls to provide status updates and remind tribes of the revised comment period deadline (and upcoming rule proposals).

RE: Government-to-Government Consultation between EPA and the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe, Second Meeting Request

Dear Administrator McCarthy:

On July 10, 2014, the EPA held the first government-to-government consultation meeting with the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe (Tribe) regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. The Tribe was pleased to have this initial opportunity to consult with your agency regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. During the meeting, the Tribe emphasized to the EPA that, due to the complexity of the issues and questions presented during the consultation meeting and the fact that the EPA was not prepared to answer all the Tribe's questions at that time, additional consultation meetings would be necessary during the public comment period for this rulemaking. I am now formally requesting that the EPA hold a second consultation meeting with the Tribe on the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking at least three weeks in advance of the close of the public comment period.

During the July 10, 2014 meeting, the Tribe also requested that future consultation meetings on this rulemaking allow in-person discussion between the Tribe and staff from the EPA Headquarters office. We appreciated that three EPA employees from Region 8 (Deb Thomas, Alfreda Mitre, and Angelique Diaz) attended the July 10, 2014 consultation meeting in person, but we believe that it is important that we be able to communicate directly, and in person, with representatives from the EPA Headquarters office (including the EPA lead for the rulemaking, Reid Rosnick) who have the authority and the responsibility to make decisions regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. We understand that Mr. Rosnick may have certain health-related limitations on travel during the public comment period, and the Tribe can offer to have certain Tribal staff and leadership travel to accommodate this in-person meeting.

EPA HEARING ON SUBPART W DENVER — SEPTEMBER 3 AND 4

URANIUM WATCH COMMENTS

Below are written comments that were, generally, presented in the first session of the Environmental Protection Agency hearings on proposed changes to 40 C.F.R. Part 61 Subpart W on September 3, 2014, in Denver, Colorado. Uranium Watch will be submitting written comments with more detailed information on the issues below and other aspects of the proposed rule.

- 1. The Subpart W proposed rule is contained misleading, incomplete, and false information.
- 2. The EPA failed to place relevant documents on the Subpart W website.
- 3. The EPA sent letters to uranium mill licensees asking with questions about their mills and 11e.(2) byproduct material impoundments, but failed to send letters to the Sweetwater and Shootaring Canyon Mill licensees. The White Mesa Mill licensee failed to respond to the EPA May 2009 request for information.
- 4. The EPA's justifies the elimination of the radon emission standard for "existing" impoundments, including the monitoring and reporting requirement by various claims. The EPA claims that White Mesa Mill Cell 3 will close at the end of 2014. This is not true. Energy Fuels is keeping Cell 3 open to receive ISL waste because it cannot dispose of ISL waste in the new Cell 4A until more solid tailings have been disposed of in Cell 4A (so there is a base for the burial of the ISL waste) and until there is a license amendment authorizing disposal of ISL waste in Cell 4A. Also, there must be an approved radon closure plan and reclamation milestones for Cell 3 incorporated in the White Mesa Mill license for the cell to enter the closure period.

The EPA claims that both the Shootaring Canyon and Sweetwater impoundments comply with the requirements for "new" impoundments in 40 C.F.R. § 61.252(b). This is not true. The Shootaring Canyon impoundment does not have a synthetic liner, as the EPA claimed in the proposed rule. It has a clay liner. The Sweetwater impoundment is 60 acres, much larger than the required 40 acre impoundment.

- 5. The EPA should remember that Subpart W is an "emission" standard under the Clean Air Act. Yet, the EPA intends to completely eliminate any semblance of an emission limit for radon from operating uranium mills. Now there will only be design and work practice standards for conventional, ISL, and heap leach facilities. The proposed rule does not comply with the requirements of the Clean Air Act at Section 112(h). Section 112(h) states:
 - (h) WORK PRACTICE STANDARDS AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS.

Uranium Watch/EPA Subpart W Hearing Comments 2 September 4, 2014

(1) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of this section, if it is not feasible in the judgment of the Administrator to prescribe or enforce an emission standard for control of a hazardous air pollutant or pollutants, the Administrator may, in lieu thereof, promulgate a design, equipment, work practice, or operational standard, or combination thereof, which in the Administrator's judgment is consistent with the provisions of subsection

For the purpose of this subsection, the phrase "not feasible to prescribe or enforce an emission standard" means any situation in which the Administrator determines that—

(B) the application of measurement methodology to a particular class of sources is not practicable due to technological and economic limitations.

What this means is that for the EPA to promulgate a design, equipment, work practice, or operational standard, or combination thereof, IN PLACE OF an emission standard for control of a hazardous air pollutant, the Administrator must find that it is not feasible to prescribe or enforce an emission standard. Not feasible would mean that "the application of measurement methodology to a particular class of sources is not practicable due to technological and economic limitations."

The EPA Administrator has not made such a finding, nor could she make such a finding. The EPA didn't even include a discussion of this requirement in the Subpart W rulemaking.

In sum: the EPA must have radon emissions limits for "existing" and "new" conventional, non-conventional, and heap leach impoundments.

6. The Evaporation Pond Risk Assessment at Table 2: Radon Flux for Various Radium Concentrations shows the radon flux from three conventional mills and the eight ISL facilities for radium concentrations of 1, 100, and 1,000 pCi/L. The Risk Assessment concludes, "The fluxes at the largest concentration, while below the criteria, are not negligible." However, the largest concentration is not the actual concentration, it is the concentration per 1000 pCi/L. So, a pond with a concentration of 36,700 pCi/L would have a radon flux far in excess of the current 20 pCi/m²-sec criteria. The Risk Assessment should have, but did not, compare the actual radon flux for the various evaporation ponds

Table 2 fails to include, for comparison, the actual radium concentrations for the evaporation ponds at ISL and conventional mills. There is no data in the Subpart W Rulemaking Docket regarding the radium concentration in liquid impoundments at the Sweetwater and White Mesa Mills. So, information regarding the actual radon flux from those mills is completely disregarded by the EPA. Therefore, the EPA has no basis for the assumption that those emissions will be "very low" (what ever that means).

Uranium Watch/EPA Subpart W Hearing Comments 3 September 4, 2014

There is recent data regarding the radium concentration at the impoundments at the White Mesa Mill. The White Mesa Mill 2013 Annual Tailings Wastewater Monitoring Report² provides data on the Gross Radium Alpha (pCi/L) for the liquids in 4 impoundments. Cell 1 is a liquid evaporation pond, Cell 4B is being used as a liquid impoundment, and Cell 3 and Cell 4A have a liquid pond on top of the more solid tailings. The information for Table 1 is based on the assumption provided by the EPA that a White Mesa liquid impoundment has a radon flux of 7.0 pCi/m²-sec for every 1,000 pCi/L of radium. Unfortunately, the EPA never required the White Mesa licensee to report on the radium content of the liquids in the tailings cells and calculate the radon flux based on those measurements.

The data for White Mesa Mill liquid impoundments does not support the EPA's claim that radon emissions from evaporation ponds "will be expected to be very low" and "the chance of radon emissions is small." In fact, at the White Mesa Mill, the radon emissions are very high. Yet the EPA does not consider these emissions when determining compliance with the current radon emission standard for "existing" impoundments. In 2013, that was Cells 3 and 2.

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For the purpose of this subsection, the phrase "not feasible to prescribe or enforce an emission standard" means any situation in which the Administrator determines that—

(B) the application of measurement methodology to a particular class of sources is not practicable due to technological and economic limitations.

What this means is that for the EPA to promulgate a design, equipment, work practice, or operational standard, or combination thereof, IN PLACE OF an emission standard for control of a hazardous air pollutant, the Administrator must find that it is not feasible to prescribe or enforce an emission standard. Not feasible would mean that "the application of measurement methodology to a particular class of sources is not practicable due to technological and economic limitations."

The EPA Administrator has not made such a finding, nor could she make such a finding. The EPA didn't even include a discussion of this requirement in the Subpart W rulemaking.

In sum: the EPA must have radon emissions limits for "existing" and "new" conventional, non-conventional, and heap leach impoundments.

6. The Evaporation Pond Risk Assessment at Table 2: Radon Flux for Various Radium Concentrations shows the radon flux from three conventional mills and the eight ISL facilities for radium concentrations of 1, 100, and 1,000 pCi/L. The Risk Assessment concludes, "The fluxes at the largest concentration, while below the criteria, are not negligible." However, the largest concentration is not the actual concentration, it is the concentration per 1000 pCi/L. So, a pond with a concentration of 36,700 pCi/L would have a radon flux far in excess of the current 20 pCi/m²-sec criteria. The Risk Assessment should have, but did not, compare the actual radon flux for the various evaporation ponds

Table 2 fails to include, for comparison, the actual radium concentrations for the evaporation ponds at ISL and conventional mills. There is no data in the Subpart W Rulemaking Docket regarding the radium concentration in liquid impoundments at the Sweetwater and White Mesa Mills. So, information regarding the actual radon flux from those mills is completely disregarded by the EPA. Therefore, the EPA has no basis for the assumption that those emissions will be "very low" (what ever that means).

Uranium Watch/EPA Subpart W Hearing Comments 3 September 4, 2014

There is recent data regarding the radium concentration at the impoundments at the White Mesa Mill. The White Mesa Mill 2013 Annual Tailings Wastewater Monitoring Report² provides data on the Gross Radium Alpha (pCi/L) for the liquids in 4 impoundments. Cell 1 is a liquid evaporation pond, Cell 4B is being used as a liquid impoundment, and Cell 3 and Cell 4A have a liquid pond on top of the more solid tailings. The information for Table 1 is based on the assumption provided by the EPA that a White Mesa liquid impoundment has a radon flux of 7.0 pCi/m²-sec for every 1,000 pCi/L of radium. Unfortunately, the EPA never required the White Mesa licensee to report on the radium content of the liquids in the tailings cells and calculate the radon flux based on those measurements.

The data for White Mesa Mill liquid impoundments does not support the EPA's claim that radon emissions from evaporation ponds "will be expected to be very low" and "the chance of radon emissions is small." In fact, at the White Mesa Mill, the radon emissions are very high. Yet the EPA does not consider these emissions when determining compliance with the current radon emission standard for "existing" impoundments. In 2013, that was Cells 3 and 2.

Paul,

I have reviewed the document you provided to me in your e-mail of 14 October 2009. The document was produced for Cotter by MFG, Inc, dated 20 May 2004 with the subject heading of Proposed Sampler Specific Radon Concentrations. You asked me to review the proposed approach and comment on three issues that you raised in your e-mail.

- 1. Sample sizes being used to calculate means and standard deviations.
- 2. Creation of a background radon measurement by taking the mean and adding 2 standard deviations to create average background
- 3. Not applying the same statistical approach to the downgradient radon samples.

Before I answer your questions, I am including a couple of caveats. In reviewing this information it is clear to me that it is not part of any sampling program for NESHAP Subpart W. I can only assume therefore that this is a program that has been proposed in conjunction with the facility's operating license. This program is administered by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) unless that program is run by an Agreement State. The State of Colorado is an Agreement State, and I am unclear on exactly why this sampling program was proposed. Also, since the memo was produced in May 2004, it is unclear to me whether this proposed method was actually reviewed and/or approved for use. I would need to examine considerably more documentation before I could determine the usefulness of this proposed sampling program, and frankly, since it is not related to Subpart W, I do not have the time to explore it for further follow-up. I suggest that you continue to raise this issue with the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. I will, however, answer your questions in a general sense, as it relates to Subpart W.

Regarding sample size as it relates to calculation of means/standard deviations, NESHAP Subpart W requires in Method 115 a specific number of flux measurements for a tailings facility:

Water saturated beaches -100 flux measurements Loose and dry top surfaces -100 flux measurements Sides -100 flux measurements, unless soil is used in dam construction Water covered areas - no flux measurements

Although no background measurements are specified in this test, it is generally assumed that flux measurements will be on the order of 100 in order to be consistent with the downgradient measurements. One hundred samples produce a more normal distribution, and allows for greater confidence in the data. As you know, in general sample sizes of less than 30 do not usually produce results accurate to a specified confidence and margin of error unless the population is normally distributed. Further, the locations for determining background are assumed to be free of tailings, and are truly representative of existing natural background for radon.

In Subpart W, after the samples are collected, the mean radon flux from the pile shall be the arithmetic mean of the mean radon flux for each sector of the tailings pile. Addition of any number of standard deviations is not permitted. The number of samples required more than compensates for using problematical statistical methods. Further, the weather conditions, moisture content of the tailings, and the area of the pile covered by water must be delineated in the analysis, and must be chosen at the time of measurement to provide representative long-term radon flux.

Lastly for Subpart W, the mean of the radon flux samples is compared to the mean of the background samples. There are no methods used to compensate for lack of data, such as employing the standard deviation to background, and comparing it to just the mean of the downgradient data. If the resultant flux rate is greater than 20 pCi/m²/sec, the pile is in violation. I should mention that while we will possibly consider various alternatives to the sampling method utilized in Method 115, we will not be considering the use of alternate, unsupported or untenable statistical methods that gives the appearance of data treatment.

I hope this helps, as I stated earlier, I have responsibilities with Subpart W that are mandated by law, and I must concentrate my efforts to meet those deadlines. Thanks for the opportunity to have a look at the proposal.

EPA HEARING ON SUBPART W DENVER — SEPTEMBER 3 AND 4

URANIUM WATCH COMMENTS

Below are written comments that were, generally, presented in the first session of the Environmental Protection Agency hearings on proposed changes to 40 C.F.R. Part 61 Subpart W on September 3, 2014, in Denver, Colorado. Uranium Watch will be submitting written comments with more detailed information on the issues below and other aspects of the proposed rule.

- 1. The Subpart W proposed rule is contained misleading, incomplete, and false information.
- 2. The EPA failed to place relevant documents on the Subpart W website.
- 3. The EPA sent letters to uranium mill licensees asking with questions about their mills and 11e.(2) byproduct material impoundments, but failed to send letters to the Sweetwater and Shootaring Canyon Mill licensees. The White Mesa Mill licensee failed to respond to the EPA May 2009 request for information.
- 4. The EPA's justifies the elimination of the radon emission standard for "existing" impoundments, including the monitoring and reporting requirement by various claims. The EPA claims that White Mesa Mill Cell 3 will close at the end of 2014. This is not true. Energy Fuels is keeping Cell 3 open to receive ISL waste because it cannot dispose of ISL waste in the new Cell 4A until more solid tailings have been disposed of in Cell 4A (so there is a base for the burial of the ISL waste) and until there is a license amendment authorizing disposal of ISL waste in Cell 4A. Also, there must be an approved radon closure plan and reclamation milestones for Cell 3 incorporated in the White Mesa Mill license for the cell to enter the closure period.

The EPA claims that both the Shootaring Canyon and Sweetwater impoundments comply with the requirements for "new" impoundments in 40 C.F.R. § 61.252(b). This is not true. The Shootaring Canyon impoundment does not have a synthetic liner, as the EPA claimed in the proposed rule. It has a clay liner. The Sweetwater impoundment is 60 acres, much larger than the required 40 acre impoundment.

- 5. The EPA should remember that Subpart W is an "emission" standard under the Clean Air Act. Yet, the EPA intends to completely eliminate any semblance of an emission limit for radon from operating uranium mills. Now there will only be design and work practice standards for conventional, ISL, and heap leach facilities. The proposed rule does not comply with the requirements of the Clean Air Act at Section 112(h). Section 112(h) states:
 - (h) WORK PRACTICE STANDARDS AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS.

Uranium Watch/EPA Subpart W Hearing Comments 2 September 4, 2014

(1) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of this section, if it is not feasible in the judgment of the Administrator to prescribe or enforce an emission standard for control of a hazardous air pollutant or pollutants, the Administrator may, in lieu thereof, promulgate a design, equipment, work practice, or operational standard, or combination thereof, which in the Administrator's judgment is consistent with the provisions of subsection

For the purpose of this subsection, the phrase "not feasible to prescribe or enforce an emission standard" means any situation in which the Administrator determines that—

(B) the application of measurement methodology to a particular class of sources is not practicable due to technological and economic limitations.

What this means is that for the EPA to promulgate a design, equipment, work practice, or operational standard, or combination thereof, IN PLACE OF an emission standard for control of a hazardous air pollutant, the Administrator must find that it is not feasible to prescribe or enforce an emission standard. Not feasible would mean that "the application of measurement methodology to a particular class of sources is not practicable due to technological and economic limitations."

The EPA Administrator has not made such a finding, nor could she make such a finding. The EPA didn't even include a discussion of this requirement in the Subpart W rulemaking.

In sum: the EPA must have radon emissions limits for "existing" and "new" conventional, non-conventional, and heap leach impoundments.

6. The Evaporation Pond Risk Assessment at Table 2: Radon Flux for Various Radium Concentrations shows the radon flux from three conventional mills and the eight ISL facilities for radium concentrations of 1, 100, and 1,000 pCi/L. The Risk Assessment concludes, "The fluxes at the largest concentration, while below the criteria, are not negligible." However, the largest concentration is not the actual concentration, it is the concentration per 1000 pCi/L. So, a pond with a concentration of 36,700 pCi/L would have a radon flux far in excess of the current 20 pCi/m²-sec criteria. The Risk Assessment should have, but did not, compare the actual radon flux for the various evaporation ponds

Table 2 fails to include, for comparison, the actual radium concentrations for the evaporation ponds at ISL and conventional mills. There is no data in the Subpart W Rulemaking Docket regarding the radium concentration in liquid impoundments at the Sweetwater and White Mesa Mills. So, information regarding the actual radon flux from those mills is completely disregarded by the EPA. Therefore, the EPA has no basis for the assumption that those emissions will be "very low" (what ever that means).

Uranium Watch/EPA Subpart W Hearing Comments 3 September 4, 2014

There is recent data regarding the radium concentration at the impoundments at the White Mesa Mill. The White Mesa Mill 2013 Annual Tailings Wastewater Monitoring Report² provides data on the Gross Radium Alpha (pCi/L) for the liquids in 4 impoundments. Cell 1 is a liquid evaporation pond, Cell 4B is being used as a liquid impoundment, and Cell 3 and Cell 4A have a liquid pond on top of the more solid tailings. The information for Table 1 is based on the assumption provided by the EPA that a White Mesa liquid impoundment has a radon flux of 7.0 pCi/m²-sec for every 1,000 pCi/L of radium. Unfortunately, the EPA never required the White Mesa licensee to report on the radium content of the liquids in the tailings cells and calculate the radon flux based on those measurements.

Table. 1. White Mesa Mill Radium Concentration and Radon Flux for 2013.

Yet the EPA does not consider these emissions when determining compliance with the current radon emission standard for "existing" impoundments. In 2013, that was Cells 3 and 2.

On July 10, 2014, the EPA held the first government-to-government consultation meeting with the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe (Tribe) regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. The Tribe was pleased to have this initial opportunity to consult with your agency regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. During the meeting, the Tribe emphasized to the EPA that, due to the complexity of the issues and questions presented during the consultation meeting and the fact that the EPA was not prepared to answer all the Tribe's questions at that time, additional consultation meetings would be necessary during the public comment period for this rulemaking. I am now formally requesting that the EPA hold a second consultation meeting with the Tribe on the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking at least three weeks in advance of the close of the public comment period.

During the July 10, 2014 meeting, the Tribe also requested that future consultation meetings on this rulemaking allow in-person discussion between the Tribe and staff from the EPA Headquarters office. We appreciated that three EPA employees from Region 8 (Deb Thomas, Alfreda Mitre, and Angelique Diaz) attended the July 10, 2014 consultation meeting in person, but we believe that it is important that we be able to communicate directly, and in person, with representatives from the EPA Headquarters office (including the EPA lead for the rulemaking, Reid Rosnick) who have the authority and the responsibility to make decisions regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. We understand that Mr. Rosnick may have certain health-related limitations on travel during the public comment period, and the Tribe can offer to have certain Tribal staff and leadership travel to accommodate this in-person meeting.

Dear Administrator McCarthy:

On July 10, 2014, the EPA held the first government-to-government consultation meeting with the Ute Mountain Ute Tribe (Tribe) regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. The Tribe was pleased to have this initial opportunity to consult with your agency regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. During the meeting, the Tribe emphasized to the EPA that, due to the complexity of the issues and questions presented during the consultation meeting and the fact that the EPA was not prepared to answer all the Tribe's questions at that time, additional consultation meetings would be necessary during the public comment period for this rulemaking. I am now formally requesting that the EPA hold a second consultation meeting with the Tribe on the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking at least three weeks in advance of the close of the public comment period.

During the July 10, 2014 meeting, the Tribe also requested that future consultation meetings on this rulemaking allow in-person discussion between the Tribe and staff from the EPA Headquarters office. We appreciated that three EPA employees from Region 8 (Deb Thomas, Alfreda Mitre, and Angelique Diaz) attended the July 10, 2014 consultation meeting in person, but we believe that it is important that we be able to communicate directly, and in person, with representatives from the EPA Headquarters office (including the EPA lead for the rulemaking, Reid Rosnick) who have the authority and the responsibility to make decisions regarding the NESHAPS Subpart W rulemaking. We understand that Mr. Rosnick may have certain health-related limitations on travel during the public comment period, and the Tribe can offer to have certain Tribal staff and leadership travel to accommodate this in-person meeting.

Paul.

I have reviewed the document you provided to me in your e-mail of 14 October 2009. The document was produced for Cotter by MFG, Inc, dated 20 May 2004 with the subject heading of Proposed Sampler Specific Radon Concentrations. You asked me to review the proposed approach and comment on three issues that you raised in your e-mail.

- 1. Sample sizes being used to calculate means and standard deviations.
- 2. Creation of a background radon measurement by taking the mean and adding 2 standard deviations to create average background
- 3. Not applying the same statistical approach to the downgradient radon samples.

Before I answer your questions, I am including a couple of caveats. In reviewing this information it is clear to me that it is not part of any sampling program for NESHAP Subpart W. I can only assume therefore that this is a program that has been proposed in conjunction with the facility's operating license. This program is

administered by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) unless that program is run by an Agreement State. The State of Colorado is an Agreement State, and I am unclear on exactly why this sampling program was proposed. Also, since the memo was produced in May 2004, it is unclear to me whether this proposed method was actually reviewed and/or approved for use. I would need to examine considerably more documentation before I could determine the usefulness of this proposed sampling program, and frankly, since it is not related to Subpart W, I do not have the time to explore it for further follow-up. I suggest that you continue to raise this issue with the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. I will, however, answer your questions in a general sense, as it relates to Subpart W.

Regarding sample size as it relates to calculation of means/standard deviations, NESHAP Subpart W requires in Method 115 a specific number of flux measurements for a tailings facility:

Water saturated beaches – 100 flux measurements Loose and dry top surfaces – 100 flux measurements Sides – 100 flux measurements, unless soil is used in dam construction Water covered areas – no flux measurements

Although no background measurements are specified in this test, it is generally assumed that flux measurements will be on the order of 100 in order to be consistent with the downgradient measurements. One hundred samples produce a more normal distribution, and allows for greater confidence in the data. As you know, in general sample sizes of less than 30 do not usually produce results accurate to a specified confidence and margin of error unless the population is normally distributed. Further, the locations for determining background are assumed to be free of tailings, and are truly representative of existing natural background for radon.

In Subpart W, after the samples are collected, the mean radon flux from the pile shall be the arithmetic mean of the mean radon flux for each sector of the tailings pile. Addition of any number of standard deviations is not permitted. The number of samples required more than compensates for using problematical statistical methods. Further, the weather conditions, moisture content of the tailings, and the area of the pile covered by water must be delineated in the analysis, and must be chosen at the time of measurement to provide representative long-term radon flux.

Lastly for Subpart W, the mean of the radon flux samples is compared to the mean of the background samples. There are no methods used to compensate for lack of data, such as employing the standard deviation to background, and comparing it to just the mean of the downgradient data. If the resultant flux rate is greater than 20 pCi/m²/sec, the pile is in violation. I should mention that while we will possibly consider various alternatives to the sampling method utilized in Method 115, we will not be considering the use of alternate, unsupported or untenable statistical methods that gives the appearance of data treatment.

I hope this helps, as I stated earlier, I have responsibilities with Subpart W that are mandated by law, and I must concentrate my efforts to meet those deadlines. Thanks for the opportunity to have a look at the proposal.
