Dear Mr. Conroy:

EPA's Data Requirements rule (40 CFR 51, Subpart BB) requires each air agency to submit to their EPA Regional Office a list identifying those sources in the state with emissions above 2000 tons per year of sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>). This list is to be provided to EPA by January 15, 2016.

This letter is submitted to satisfy the requirement in 40 CFR 51.1203 to provide a list and inform you that there are no SO<sub>2</sub> sources in Rhode Island with emissions above 2000 tons per year. Based on our most recent inventory data (2014), the largest SO<sub>2</sub> source in the state, Rhode Island Hospital, had emissions of 60 tons per year.
