Implementation of Data Requirements Rule for SO₂ on the Navajo Nation – Data Requirements Rule for the 2010 1-Hour Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) Primary National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS); Final Rule

Dear Ms. Strauss:

As per the Data Requirements Rule¹ ("DRR") that requires an air agency to provide notice, by July 1, 2016, of the approach it will use to characterize air quality in the respective areas, the Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency ("NNEPA"), Air & Toxics Department ("ATD"), Air Quality Control Program ("AQCP") here informs that air quality modeling will be used to demonstrate compliance with the National Ambient Air Quality Standards ("NAAQS") for the two large sources of SO₂ on the Navajo Nation.

NNEPA submitted a draft modeling protocol to USEPA Region 9 on June 6, 2016 and in doing so believes that the July 1, 2016 deadline has been met. Since then, NNEPA has continued to participate on several calls and emails exchanges with USEPA Region 9 for the purposes of finalizing the modeling protocol and will continue to do so. As stated in the draft modeling protocol, NNEPA will use AERMOD (the latest version), and the identical geophysical and meteorological input data, modeling and receptor grids as used by the Four Corners Power Plant (FCPP) and the Navajo Generating Station (NGS) in the related modeling studies completed for recent Environmental Impact Statements (EISs) for renewal of operating leases for these two entities. The major changes between the new modeling studies we will conduct and previous studies prepared for the EISs are in the emission source terms of SO₂.
