

The Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (IDEQ) is seeking approval to administer the Idaho Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (IPDES) program regulating discharges of pollutants into waters of the United States under its jurisdiction.

If approved, IDEQ will administer the IPDES program in place of the EPA administered NPDES program. Program authority would transfer to IDEQ no sooner than July 1, 2018.

IDEQ will assume permitting and compliance authority for the NPDES program in four phases. The EPA will retain full permitting and compliance authority over facilities until that authority is transferred to IDEQ in accordance with the following schedule:





- Phase I Individual Municipal Permits and Pretreatment upon gaining program authority (July 1, 2018)
- Phase II Individual Industrial Permits, one year after program authorization (July 1, 2019)
- Phase III General Permits (Aquaculture, Pesticide, CAFO, Suction Dredge, Remediation), two years after program authorization (July 1, 2020)
- Phase IV Federal Facilities, General and Individual Stormwater Permits and Biosolids (Sludge), three years after program authorization (July 1, 2021)

Public Comment Period

The EPA will consider comments on the IPDES program application before making a final decision. Idaho Tribes

EPA will retain authority for NPDES permits for discharges to tribal waters.

- EPA will coordinate with interested tribes and provide an opportunity for Government-to-Government consulation prior to IPDES program approval.
- EPA currently administers approximatley 17 tribal NPDES permits in Idaho.
