This letter serves as EPA's transmittal to you of the "Willamette Basin Mercury Total Maximum Daily Load, December 30, 2019 as revised on February 4, 2021" (TMDL). Pursuant to § 303(d)(2) of the Clean Water Act and 40 C.F.R. § 130.7(d)(2), EPA has established this TMDL and is hereby providing it to the State for implementation.

EPA's TMDL was made available for public comment on January 6, 2020. The comments we received that resulted in changes to the TMDL are summarized, along with EPA's response, in the attached document. The complete "response to comments" document is posted on our website.

EPA recognizes ODEQ's diligent efforts to address mercury as a pollutant in the Willamette Basin and its recent extensive work to engage communities and the general public in implementing the TMDL.
