SUBJECT: Reallotment of Fiscal Year 2022 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Clean Water State Revolving Fund Emerging Contaminants Funds

This memorandum announces the availability of reallotted federal fiscal year (FY) 2022 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) dollars. These funds originated from BIL (P.L. 117-58), also known as the "Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021" (IIJA). This action makes critical additional emerging contaminant funds available to states across the nation.

In 2023, the State of Mississippi declined \$842,000 of its FY 2022 CWSRF BIL Emerging Contaminant (EC) allotment due to a lack of available projects. The EPA is working closely with the state so that they can successfully apply for future years of funding for this program. Because these funds were declined, they remain unobligated. By law, the EPA must reallot unobligated funds after the second fiscal year of availability. The process is explained in the September 11, 2020, memorandum, "[State Revolving Fund Capitalization Grant Reallotment Procedure](#)."

Per statute, recipients that declined funding or did not receive the full CWSRF BIL EC allotment (including 604(b) funds) within the first federal fiscal year of availability are ineligible for reallotted funds. Attachment A lists the state-by-state EC reallotment amounts.

Eligible states, Puerto Rico, District of Columbia, and the territories have until September 30, 2024, to apply for and receive their portion of the reallotted funds. Any available funds remaining unawarded after that date will be available for reallotment.

These reallotted funds carry all program requirements and authorities associated with the FY 2022 BIL EC appropriation and all current statutory requirements. Regions and states should review the March 2022, memorandum "[Implementation of the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund](#)

[Provisions of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.](#)” Attachment B shows the state-by-state mandatory additional subsidy and green project reserve amounts.

Please see the abovementioned September 2020 reallocation memorandum for details about mechanisms Regions may use to award the funds and expectations for binding commitments and disbursements.
