Funding Opportunity Overview

Provide training, technical assistance, research, and tools to Tribal environmental staff to build Tribal capacity to develop sustainable waste management programs and implement cleanup, prevention, and response programs in Indian country.

Conduct activities that promote discussion, collaboration, engagement, and partnership among Tribes and federal agency representatives.

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

Funding Information

- EPA anticipates awarding two separate cooperative agreements to one successful applicant.
- The total estimated funding is **\$3,480,000**.
- The total estimated funding for Project One is **\$1,565,000**.
 - In FY25, the Project One maximum value shall not exceed **\$313,000**.
- The total estimated funding for Project Two is **\$1,915,000**.
 - In FY25, the Project Two maximum value shall not exceed \$383,000.
- No matching required.
- Estimated start date is January 1, 2025.
- All project activities must be completed within the **5-year period of performance**, ending December 31, 2029.



Application

Submitted to grants.gov by 11:59 pm ET on October 10, 2024

Eligible Entities

- Federally recognized Tribes and inter-Tribal consortia.
- Public and private non-profit universities and colleges.
- Other public or private non-profit organizations.
- For-profit firms are not eligible.
- Nonprofit organizations exempt from taxation that lobby are not eligible.




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Threshold Eligibility

- 1. Demonstration that applicant is an eligible entity.
- 2. Two applications are submitted: Project One and Project Two.
 - Applications address all elements described in the scope of work: four in Project One application, six in Project Two application.
- 3. Application includes a process for ensuring that TWAR SC members are elected Tribal officials or they have been designated by their Tribe's elected leaders to represent their Tribe on the TWAR SC.
- 4. Project One does not exceed **\$1,565,000** over the 5-year period.
- 5. Project Two does not exceed **\$1,915,000** over the 5-year period.
- 6. Applications meet the requirements including mandatory documents, page limits, readable format and font type, etc.
- 7. Applications are submitted through grants.gov.

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
Narrative Proposal

- 1. Cover Letter.
- 2. Project Description.
- 3. Programmatic Capability and Past Performance.
- 4. Performance Measurement: Anticipated Outcomes and Outputs.
- 5. Budget/Resources.


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Review and Selection


- Only applications determined eligible will be evaluated for technical merit. Each eligible application will be evaluated by a review panel of EPA staff for technical merit.
- Applicants must directly and explicitly address the criteria in Section 5 of the NOFO as part of their "Narrative Proposal." There are separate criteria for Projects One and Two.
- Applications for Projects One and Two will be evaluated separately.
- Each application will be rated under a points system, with a total of 100 points possible for each of Projects One and Two.
- The evaluated numerical scores from applications for both projects will be combined for a total of 200 points possible and will be placed in rank order. The review panel will recommend the application with the highest combined evaluated numerical score to the EPA Selection Official for award.

- Once your SAM.gov account is active, you must register in <u>www.Grants.gov</u>.
- Submit application through Grants.gov by 11:59 pm ET on October 10, 2024.
