

## **How to Report Sewage Emergencies in the Metro East Area**

Sewer overflows happen when excessive rain overwhelms sewer systems, causing stormwater runoff to mix with raw sewage and other pollutants. These overflows can cause serious health and water-quality problems. In the event of an overflow, it's important to report it to the local city where it's happening to avoid response delays.
